Ariel Rivka Dance (ARD) is an all-female identifying company based in New Jersey/ New York and led by Artistic and Executive Director Ariel Grossman. ARD's mission is to champion female creatives through original choreography, commissioned music, and curated family and educational programming. Drawing from Ariel's personal experiences as a woman and mother, the company shares stories that resonate with a broad audience.

Through movement, ARD creates a community of vulnerability and acceptance, providing opportunities for hope and connection.



ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Ariel Rebecca (Rivka) Grossman a native New York, founded Ariel Rivka Dance in 2008. She trained at the Joffrey Ballet School under the direction of Gerald Arpino with Eleanor D'antouno (American Ballet Theater), John Magnus, and Dorothy Lister. She also attended LaGuardia High School of Music and Art and the Performing Arts as a dance major and studied with Elisa King (Zvi Gotheiner Dance), Brunhilda Ruiz (The Joffrey Ballet), Michelle Benash (American Ballet Theater) and Penny Frank (Martha Graham Dance Company). Ariel earned a Bachelor of Science in Dance and a Minor in Women's Studies from Skidmore College and a master's in Early Childhood Education from Bank Street College.

Ariel's work has been presented worldwide, including New Jersey Performing Arts Center, BAM Fisher, New York Live Arts, Bryant Park Summer Series, Oklahoma Intl. Dance Festival, Detroit Dance City Festival, Moulin/Belle, France, and Istanbul Fringe Festival. Ariel has been commissioned by DanceLabNY, Konverjdans, Nickerson-Rossi Dance, and Ballet Vero Beach. She has collaborated with Taylor 2, Heidi Latsky, Carolyn Dorfman Dance Company, and Sean Curran. Ariel's a past recipient of the NJPAC (New) Moves Fellowship, Dance Lab Nexus Lab Residency, Monira Artist Residency, and Nimbus Arts Center Residency. She has been awarded grants by Mid Atlantic Arts, New Jersey State Arts Council, Jersey City Arts Council, Princeton Community Foundation, DanceNYC, Dance New Jersey, Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, Nathan Cummings Foundation, and The Charles & Joan Gross Family Foundation.


ARIEL

This work can be performed as a 12-minute excerpt, 20-minutes, or in its entirety of 40-minutes. 7-8 dancers, 1 tech

It is not always easy to determine what you want. Ariel Rivka Dance opens up space for self-reflection in the company's expansive evening-length piece featuring the collaboration with DJ and Music Producer Summer Dregs. From moments of stillness and solitude to bursts of energy and passion, the company's new work showcases the vulnerability needed to fly, even at the risk of falling. Choreographer Ariel Grossman seeks out the true self-uncovering layers imposed by others and ones we use to protect ourselves-through expressive duets, lingering solos, and powerful collective displays. Each part highlights the strength in desire and honesty in perseverance. With live or pre-recorded music by new company collaborator Summer Dregs, this work asks audiences to probe deeper to find what they truly want.

Summer Dregs (Carl Cadwell) brings stunningly unexpected and unique music to life. From scoring ballets and commercials to producing and mixing for R&B or lofi artists, Summer Dregs works with collaborators to make art only they together could make. Carl started off touring with jazz-fusion and old soul outfits. Though the percussion and urgency of those early groups can still be felt in his music, his love for the rhythms of modern R&B and global-pop soon took center stage.





WOMEN & MOTHERS

Exploring the many faces of womanhood, ARD's Women & Mothers program delves into the juxtaposition of who we are with ourselves, and who we chose to let the world see.

With a total runtime of 45 minutes, this program takes the audience through the emotional waves of motherhood; a rebirth, inspired by a woman leaving a strict Hasidic sect; an intimate look at the deep layers and entangled cycles of love and hate within a marriage; and examines how familial love evokes positive and negative impulses where frustration and desire compete with the need for space and independence.

This program strives to inspire conversation across generations and genders.

HERITAGE & TRADITION

This program investigates the traditions and stories that make a community. The Book of Esther, which is often performed in excerpts, tells the story of the biblical Queen Vashti and Queen Esther through emotionally driven movement, epitomizing the Jewish traditions of collaboration and support. Inspired by the novel of the same name, Unorthodox questions the bonds that rule the structure of our lives. Perfectly complementing these two, Ori is a contemporary exploration of light and athleticism accompanied by 4 amplified cellos. This program aims to help forge stronger bonds through meaningful conversation.



COMPOSER'S NOTEBOOK Stephania de Kenessey

This program celebrates the collaboration between composer Stephania de Kenessey and Artistic Director Ariel Grossman and their ongoing exploration of womanhood. Program highlights include She, a work that delves into the waves of motherhood and features a unique soundscape of layering breast pump sounds by de Kenessey.

De Kenessey excels at creating dynamic electronic and melodic scores to compliment ARD's emotive choreography. Her instrumental and vocal music has been performed extensively in venues ranging from Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center to Joe's Pub, LaMama, and New York Live Arts. Trained at Yale and Princeton, de Kenessey is steadfastly committed to honoring women composers and is the founding president of the International Alliance for Women in Music.

COMPOSER'S NOTEBOOK David Homan

This program highlights ARD's long-time collaborator, composer David Homan. Homan's work aims to be approachable, inspire vulnerability within the audience, and act as a guide through hypnotic choreography. Homan's music has been performed in the US, Europe, Israel, and in New York at Carnegie Hall/Weill Hall, Merkin Hall, CAMI Hall, the Thalia at Symphony Space as well as major dance venues such as NYLA, Joyce Soho, the Di Capo Opera Theatre, MMAC, and the Joyce. He has also composed the music for the award-winning 2001 Fringe Festival Production Einstein's Dreams, and written theatrical scores for As You Like It, Hamlet, King Lear, and Great Expectations, among others. Major groups such as the American Symphony Orchestra have performed his works, as well as dance commissions and choreographers around the US.




ASIA BONILLA
